

EXAMINATION OF THE SANDBACH NEIGHBOURHOOD DEVELOPMENT PLAN (REVIEW)

Following the submission for examination of the modification proposal to the Sandbach Neighbourhood Development Plan (the draft Plan), I would like to clarify some procedural matters. I also have a small number of preliminary questions for Cheshire East Council (CEC) and Sandbach Town Council (STC). These are attached as an Annex to this letter. I would like to receive a written response(s) by **16 December 2021**.

### 1. Examination Documentation

I can confirm that I am satisfied that I have received a complete submission of the modification proposal, including the draft Plan (as proposed to be modified); the summary of the proposals; the Basic Conditions and Consultation Statements; the Regulation 16 representations; these include confirmation from CEC and STC that the modifications contained in the draft Plan are not so significant or substantial as to change the nature of the neighbourhood development plan which the draft Plan would replace.

This has provided sufficient information to undertake my initial determination under paragraph 10(1) of Schedule A2 to the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 (as amended).

### Determination under Paragraph 10(1) of Schedule A2<sup>1</sup>

I am required to determine whether the modifications contained in the draft Plan are so significant or substantial as to change the nature of the neighbourhood development plan which the draft Plan would replace. The purpose of this determination is to establish the appropriate examination process for the draft Plan which will, amongst other things, affect whether or not the draft Plan will need to be the subject of a referendum if it is to be made.

STC is of the opinion that the changes to the original plan are material modifications and do require examination. STC consider that the material modifications are not so significant or substantial as to change the nature of the plan and therefore a referendum is not required. This is because the policies have been updated to reflect the changes in the local policy framework and the National

Planning Policy Framework (NPPF). In this regard, the Cheshire East Local Plan Part One was adopted after the original Sandbach Neighbourhood Plan was made; and Part Two of the Local Plan, the draft Site Allocations and Development Policies Document, has since been prepared and is advancing through its Examination. Furthermore, the NPPF has been updated.

STC adds that the majority of the Plan and its policies remain unchanged whilst no site allocations are made for development.

Within its Regulation 16 consultation response, CEC states that the proposed modifications have evolved following engagement between STC and CEC and in the context of the emerging Local Plan Part 2. CEC considers that the modifications represent material modifications which do not change the nature of the plan and therefore require an examination but not a referendum. To conform with Regulation 17(e)(ii)<sup>2</sup>, I require a written statement which expands further on this position (see below).

Nonetheless, having assessed the written submissions, including the representations, I am currently of the view that the modifications proposed in the draft Plan are material but do not change the nature of the made Plan.

Therefore, the examination can proceed under the terms of Schedule A2 and, as a consequence, should I recommend that the draft Plan be made (with or without examiner modifications), a referendum stage will not be a necessary part of the statutory process.

### 3. Site Visit

I intend to undertake a site visit to the neighbourhood plan area between 6 and 13 December. This will assist in my assessment of the draft Plan, including the issues identified in the representations.

The visit will be undertaken unaccompanied. It is very important that I am not approached to discuss any aspects of the draft Plan or the neighbourhood area, as this may be perceived to prejudice my independence and risk compromising the fairness of the examination process.

### 4. Written Representations

At this stage and in light of the detailed submissions made and issues raised, I consider the examination can be conducted solely by the written representations procedure, without the need for a hearing notwithstanding a representor request for the latter. However, I will reserve the option to convene a hearing should I consider there are exceptional reasons for doing so.

### Further Clarification

Set out in Annex 1 to this letter are initial questions seeking further clarification. I would be grateful if you can seek to provide a written response by **16 December 2021**.

### 6. Examination Timetable
