- T1 Quercus (t50 tree report) 2.5 -3m Crown Lift to low laterall limbs to remove damaged limbs. Also dead wood to make safe.
- T2 Quercus (t1 tree report) 2.5m crown lift over foot path to remove as an obstruction.
- T3 Quercus (t21 tree report 5m Latrell reduction on lowest limb over the road to lift tree and reduce lateral weight. Also to dead wood to make safe.
- T4 Quercus (t23 tree report) Reduce lowest lateral limb over road way to suitable growth point to lift the canopy of the tree to avoid further damage by lorries. Also to deadwood the tree to make safe.
- T5 Quercus (t25 Tree report) 3m Lateral reduction of over extended branches to reduce the weight of branches over carriageway. Also to dead wood and remove snapped hanging branches over road.
- T6 Quercus (t27 Tree report) 3m Selective prune to reduce weight of over extended branches over the road, to reduce future concerns. Also to deadwood to make safe.
- T7 Quercus (t28 tree report) 1m crown lift by removing the 2 lowest limbs over the road to lift out of the way of lorries. Also to dead wood to make safe.
- T8 Quercus (t29 tree report) 2m Selective Lateral reduction over the road to lift the tree and reduce weight on lateral limbs over road. Also dead wood to make safe.
- T9 Quercus (t153 tree report) Removal of two lowest limbs of 3 inch diameter to lift the canopy to avoid colission with sites tractor when mowing the grounds. Also along with these specific trees we are going to be dead wooding trees around site that are in high risk areas.

To install an electric automated iron ornate gate and iron ornate fences within the existing wall pillars that have been erected on the front boundary.

6. CONSULTATIONS

6.1 Falls Prevention Strategy Consultation

The falls prevention strategy aims to reduce the risk and severity of falls for people at risk in Cheshire East. The strategy applies to people aged 65 and over, as well as younger adults whose medical conditions increase falls risk.

There are two surveys in this consultation:

- to share experience of falls and falls prevention;
- to <u>comment</u> on the full <u>draft Falls Prevention Strategy</u>.

This consultation closes on Monday 27 March 2023.

Members discussed the report and noted that the document is aimed solely at residents falling within the home; there is no reference to outdoor falls, despite outdoor activity being encouraged and key in maintaining health and wellbeing.

In 2022 a group, consisting of various community representatives surveyed Town Centre accessibility and copy of the report findings should be submitted, along with Committee Response, as numerous potholes, uneven footpaths and damaged paving can be a risk of fall and a challenge to residents and visitors alike.

Members are encouraged to submit their own comments and the Office will share consultation via social media.

Resolved:Response to be submitted via direct email, stating that Members would like to include fall prevention for outside the home within the strategy, including reference to residents *and* visitors, for provision of safe environment where exercise is encouraged for maintaining condition to minimise risk of falls. It is a concern that this strategy concentrates solely on residents falling within the home. When including prevention of outdoor falls, consideration should be given to linking the draft document with Borough Highways and Planning, to ensure suitability of planting near to footpaths for avoidance of Highway Damage and future trip hazards.

A copy of the thorough Town Centre public realm condition report to be referenced in attachment to the response, highlighting accessibility restrictions, risks of fall and incident.

High Speed Rail (Crewe – Manchester) Bill Update

I would like to update you on the progress of the High Speed Rail (Crewe – Manchester) Bill through Parliament and the impact on residents in Sandbach. As you may be aware, following Second Reading in June 2022, a first Additional Provision (AP) was deposited in Parliament. An AP is any change which requires an amendment to the Bill; for example, if more land needs to be taken than initially planned, or if the use of a Public Right of Way is changing.

Ongoing design development work has enabled HS2 Ltd to identify further scheme changes that may be brought forward in relation to highway, environmental mitigation, and utility works. These changes are likely to be proposed in a second Additional Provision (AP2), focusing on the northern part of the route between Crewe and Manchester. Most of the proposed changes are located between Rostherne near junction 7 of the M56 and Manchester Piccadilly station.

I am hoping to deposit AP2 in Parliament later in 2023. As with the Bill and AP1 deposit, those whose property or interests are specially and directly affected by the AP2 changes will be able to submit a petition against these proposals. Through this process, they will be able to have their concerns heard by the special Select Committee which has been appointed for that purpose. There would also be a consultation on the supplementary environmental information deposited.

Changes in Sandbach

The junction of the A534 Old Mill Road and Congleton Road would be temporarily modified to include carriageway widening to enable the formation of a right-turn lane on Old Mill Road, to the east of the junction of Congleton Road and the A534 Old Mill Road. This change aims to improve traffic flow while forming part of the HS2 construction traffic route.

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In advance of asking the Bill's Select Committee to consider AP2, we must make enquiries regarding people's interest in affected land. This enables the Book of Reference (a Parliamentary Standing Order requirement) to be compiled in good time ahead of AP2 deposit. HS2 Ltd will issue Land Interest Questionnaires (LIQs) during the next few weeks.

How to find out more

I recognise that people did not choose to live along the HS2 line of route. For some, receiving an LIQ will add to the uncertainty they already feel because of HS2. To ensure those affected have the information they need, a series of engagement events will be held throughout February and March. This will include face-to-face events, online webinars, and leafleting at Manchester Piccadilly station. People receiving an LIQ will be offered the opportunity to meet with HS2 Ltd staff to further discuss the potential impacts on them and their land.
